

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome! I am looking forward to having your child be a part of my Math class this year.

This year, your students will be taught using a new method known as the “flipped classroom.”

What is the flipped classroom? This method requires students to view lecture video at home as homework, leaving class time for traditional homework and challenging cooperative and individual activities. The flipped classroom allows the teacher to be more involved in individualized student instruction, as well as being immediately available to help with homework questions.

What will your student’s homework include? Most evenings, students will be required to view a brief video (the vast majority between 15 and 20 minutes) and complete a short quiz to ensure they have watched the video. Students will use class time to work individually and cooperatively with peers and the teacher to fully understand and apply course related concepts.

These videos will be uploaded to your student’s Weber Online account. If students are unable to access these essential video lectures at home, arrangements can be made with the teacher to ensure video access.
